Flowers must be grown by the exhibitor

1- Six varieties cut flowers, not more than 3 stems of each variety. Blooms need not be same colour.

2- Four distinct varieties bulbs, corms, rhizomes; not more than 3 of each.

3- Collection of Sweet peas.

4- Bearded Iris -One Stem.

5- Dutch Iris – One Stem.

6- One Single Geranium

7- One Double Geranium.

8- One Stem Ivy Geranium.

9- Three Pelargoniums, distinct colours.

10- Four Pansies, on saucer.

11- Collection of Margurites and/or Daisies.

12- Four Roses (can be all one variety or different varieties-display singly).

13- One full blown Rose.

14- One red Rose.

15- One Cream or White Rose.

16- One pink Rose.

17- One Bi-colour Rose.

18- One Yellow Rose

19- Container of Roses, own foliage.

20- Three Calendulas (Marigolds)

21- Three Stocks, distinct colours in container

27- One cut of Shrub (named).

28- Cut of 3 flowering shrubs.

29- One cut Eremophila (Emu Bush) (named).

30- Cut of Australian Native Shrubs, 4 varieties.

31- Cut of local/indigenous shrub (single variety)

32. Cut of local/indigenous tree

33. Cut of local/indigenous grasses or wild flower

34. One cut of Grevilla

35. One cut of Callistemon (Bottle Brush)

36. One cut of Protea

37- Cut of Australian Native Trees, 4 varieties

38- Foliage Pot Plant.

39- Pot Plant/s in Flower.

40- Pot Plant, Fern.

41- Pot Plant, Orchid.

42- Pot Plant, Cactus

43- Pot Plant, Succulent

44 - One stem of flower, not previously listed.
